### Vine Street Victorian Showcase for "Santa Lucia Night," December 12

Unfortunately, we learned last night that our traditional Vine Street house is not available. If anyone knows of a house we can use that is on Vine Street between 8<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> Street, please see Jan. We will keep you updated and hopefully will announce our new venue in next week's Parent Letter.

We are doing something different this year. Instead of our Winter Program, we are participating in the Vine Street Victorian Showcase in Paso Robles on Saturday, Dec. 12. Our "scene" is to depict the Swedish Christmas tradition of St. Lucia. The festival is from 6 p.m. - 9 p.m. We perform a short procession every 20 minutes from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. We ask that students sign up for 2 times, as a dozen or so participants is all that's required at one time. Parents help by singing along with the Santa Lucia song.

Costumes are white dresses/skirts for the girls over warm clothes and white pants/sweats and shirts for the boys. Swedish children would be in their pajamas, so that's the look we're going for. If not white, light colored, please. We will provide the rest of the props: wreaths, star boy hats, tinsel, candles, or wands.

### Snickerdoodles

As part of the St. Lucia pageant, our "oldest daughter" passes out snickerdoodle cookies to the passing crowd. We need about 10 people to bake snickerdoodles for Dec. 12!
